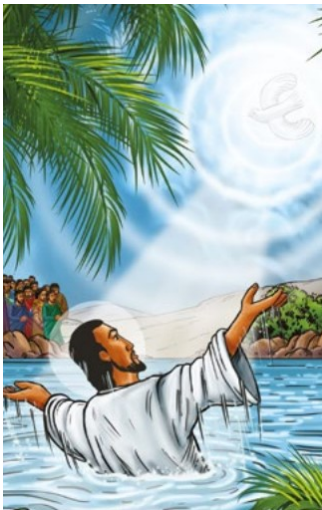

Parent Questionnaires

Thank you to all the parents who filled in a parent questionnaire during last terms parents evenings. It was great to see so many positive replies. 100% of parents felt that behaviour was good here at St Joseph's and 99% of parents feeling that their children are happy and feel safe here.

Thank you for some constructive comments regarding the children's wider personal development, with only 92% of the parents who replied said they were happy with what is provided by the school. Some parents would like to see more but understood the financial restraints of offering more trips etc.

Some other schools are able to offer more experiences such as summer fairs and a greater number of trips as they have well established PTA's (Parents and Teacher Association) which pay or subsidise other activities. These PTAs concentrate on fundraising throughout the year which then helps to pay for extra curricular wider experiences.

I think starting a PTA here at St Joseph's would be a wonderful idea not only for the pupils but also for the parents and grandparents who would like to join and make a difference to the children here.

Next week school will send out a survey to ask if anybody is interested in helping to set up the PTA, those who have the skill set to be on the committee to help organise activities and then if anybody is interested in helping at these various activities. This will be a guide to see if setting up a PTA here is a viable option as this will only work if we have enough volunteers from families of St Joseph's.
