



### **Parking**

Please ensure that you do not park on the yellow zig-zags outside of school. These have been placed to ensure the safety of our children. Under no circumstances is it safe or appropriate to also mount the kerb at this spot.

Zig-zag lines are painted onto the road to ensure a clear line of sight for pedestrians so they can both see and be seen by oncoming vehicles. This is essential for preventing accidents. It is also particularly important in areas where there are lots of small children, who are less visible to drivers. A child emerging from behind a parked car may not be spotted by a driver until it is too late.
